New Indoor Equine Riding Arena Now Open

The youth and staff at Hope Hill are thrilled to announce the opening of our new 8,500 sq. ft. indoor equine arena, as well as, the construction of an adjacent 12,000 sq. ft. outdoor arena! Along with the new construction, the Equine Assisted Counseling Program has seen tremendous change in the last few months to its curriculum and format. Through a partnership with 4-H our youth will begin a challenging Saddle Seat Riding and Training Program.

The new indoor arena provides a space for the youth that can be used year round, even in inclement weather. "This program is a one of a kind opportunity for our girls and is not offered by another all-female treatment facility anywhere in the state," said Program Manager, Alison Chambers. "This new indoor arena is one more unique resource at Hope Hill and we are enthusiastic about the positive outcomes we expect this program will produce." Alison continued by saying, "For instance, a girl here who has not bonded with another person and has no strong parental figures or support will find healing, confidence, and self-worth from

working with the horses in the program."

Elvis Alicea, Hope Hill's newly appointed Program Administrator states that, "the Equine Assisted Counseling Program teaches abused and neglected young

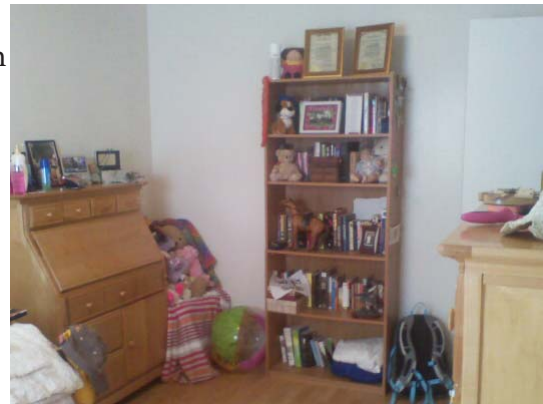

Independent Living Program Provides New Opportunities to Graduates

At Hope Hill we are determined to provide our youth from both our Residential Treatment Program and the Therapeutic Foster Care Program with every opportunity to succeed well after their time with us has expired. To us there is no greater precondition for ensuring this success than a quality education. That is why we are so enthusiastic about the addition of our new Independent Living Program. We are excited to announce that two youths from our program have enrolled at Morehead State University and Eastern Kentucky University for the Fall semester!



The program is designed to work specifically with youth in state custody who are over eighteen and would like to pursue their educational goals. With two youth already attending school this Fall and one beginning in the Spring, we are thrilled to see these opportunities beginning to open up for our youth.

Program Administrator, Kim Pulliam, explains how this program will impact the lives of the youth we serve, “The Independent Living Program will allow us to help kids without proper parental support to further their education and learn to live on their own. These kids will learn how to apply for a job, maintain a job, open a checking account, manage their finances, set up an apartment, and schedule classes among other things.” Youth in this program are expected to maintain a 2.5 GPA, have a part-time job and must pass random drug screens.

With the generous support of the community, we have been able to completely furnish two apartments near the campus of both universities. The Mt. Sterling First Church of God hosted a shower for the youth on August 21st and provided some of the essential items needed to furnish the apartments. Other donations came from donors in Washington, Ohio, and across Kentucky!

New Health Clinic Opened September 8th

Good health practices and access to a broad range of medical services are essential to the well-being of the residents of Hope Hill. We are excited to announce that this September a medical clinic will open on our campus.

Through a partnership with Dr. Taufik Kassis, owner of the Community Family Clinic, Hope Hill will be able to provide on-site treatment once a week to our girls. At this well-equipped clinic, residents will be able to receive primary medical care, pediatric care, health education, nutritional counseling, gynecological care, and a complete medical assessment. Combining the experience of Dr. Kassis and our resident nurse, Danyale Ball,

our girls will have access to the best medical care around.

Besides the benefit of comprehensive medical treatment, an on-site clinic will alleviate concerns of staff making multiple trips to town and diminish the risks associated with girls with chronic AWOL tendencies.

This additional service will coincide with our existing psychiatric treatment program which will occupy the clinic’s space two days of each month. Resident Nurse Practitioner, Jinny Woodcock, will continue to administer initial psychiatric assessments and medication

management to our residents, but the new clinic location will provide our staff and residents with a significant improvement in privacy and confidentiality.

We would like to thank the St. Joseph Mt. Sterling Medical Staff for their donation to fund the start up of the new clinic.

New Mentoring Program to Begin in Spring

Mentoring programs have been proven to have a positive impact on the lives of at risk youth. The support and involvement of a positive role model can be just what a child needs to stay on the right course to a brighter future.

Now, the youth at Hope Hill Children’s Home will have the opportunity to be partnered with a mentor from the community who can be yet another encouraging influence in the life of our youth.

The mentoring program will begin with 10 mentors and 10 youth who will be paired together for a period of at least six months. Mentors will be asked to have two weekly contacts with the youth either in person or by phone. The goal of the program is to connect our young ladies with mentors from the community who will guide, listen and share their journey as they restore hope and rebuild faith in their future.
